

Covid-19 crisis: Entry into the territory of Saint Martin and Saint Barthélemy by sea Prefectural decree n ° 2021 - 012

Wearing a mask and barrier gestures

Anyone on board a ship, whether for personal, professional or training use, is required to comply with so-called "barrier" hygiene measures, physical distancing measures and wear a protective mask.
This obligation also applies in the public spaces of ferry terminals.

Passenger ships: the shipowner must record in a document the health measures implemented

Entry requirement for pleasure craft

To go ashore – Stopover at the quay or at anchor, coming from:

- **Saint Martin, Saint Barthélemy** : without compelling reason
- **Guadeloupe, Martinique, Guyana, Sint Maarten, Anguilla, EU ports**: on compelling reasons only
 - Provide CROSS at least 48 hours before arrival with a declaration on honor of the reason (appendix 1 of the prefectural decree) + supporting documents + results of covid test (PCR) carried out less than 72 hours or proof of navigation at least 7 consecutive days without a stopover before arriving in Saint Martin or Saint Barthélemy.
 - Regular residents (with evidence) of Saint Martin / Saint Barthélemy, Sint Maarten and Anguilla exempted from PCR test if stopover less than 3 days.
- **Other sources**: on compelling reasons only
 - All requests are sent to CROSS at least 48 hours before arrival, accompanied by Annex 2 to the prefectural decree + documents justifying the reason.
 - A period of strict isolation of 7 days, without authorization to disembark, must be observed upon arrival in Saint-Martin or Saint Barthélemy, at anchor in an area decided by the port authority. At the end of this period, disembarkation authorized to perform a covid test (PCR) which ends the isolation if the result is negative.

Entry requirement for passenger ships

Stopover at the quay or at anchor, coming from:

- **Saint Martin, Saint Barthélemy** : without compelling reason
- **Sint Maarten, Anguilla** : on compelling reasons only
 - at the quay and / or stopover (with disembarkation): Provide the carrier upon boarding with a declaration of honor for the reason (Annex 1 of the AP) + supporting documents + covid test results (PCR) carried out within 72 hours; the carrier provides the CROSS and the port authority with a list of passengers + declaration of honor of absence of symptoms.
 - Regular residents (with evidence) of Saint Martin / Saint Barthélemy, Sint Maarten and Anguilla exempt from PCR test if stopover less than 3 days.
 - A / R day trip from the same embarkation / disembarkation point (day charters): declaration of the absence of symptoms.
- **Other sources**: disembarkation prohibited, anchorage authorized after presentation of the COVID test (PCR) carried out <72 hours.
